


Nursery Home Learning – Week 9

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Drawing</u></p> <p>Look in the mirror and draw what you can see. Talk about the features on your face as you draw them. Do your features look the same as other people in your house? What is different?</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>10 Frames</u></p> <table border="1" style="margin-left: auto; margin-right: auto;"> <tr><td> </td><td> </td><td> </td><td> </td><td> </td></tr> <tr><td> </td><td> </td><td> </td><td> </td><td> </td></tr> </table> <p>This is a 10 frame. You could draw one or use tape to make one on the floor. Collect 4 objects from around your house or garden. Experiment with how many different ways you can arrange the objects on your 10 frame, talking about how the amount doesn't change even when we move them around. Now try a different number.</p>											<p style="text-align: center;"><u>6 Lines</u></p> <p>Tape 6 lines onto the floor about 30cm apart (you could do more or less depending on the child)</p>  <p>Your child can jump from one line to another, try it backwards, hop, see how far they can reach forwards or sideways. They could see how far they can jump then see if they can beat their last jump.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Rocket Mice</u></p>  <p>Try the science experiment 'Rocket mice' explained on the additional page. Talk about what happens. Can you explain why that happens? Can you feel the air on your face when you squeeze the bottle near your face?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Likes and Dislikes</u></p> <p>Talk to your child about your likes and dislikes and ask your child to talk about things that they like and dislike. Model using the word 'because' to explain why you like or dislike things and encourage your children to do the same.</p> <p style="color: blue;">I like laughing because it makes me feel happy!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Peter Rabbit Counting</u></p> <p>The Cbeebies website has some great games for counting and learning about number.</p> <p>Try this Peter Rabbit game and help Peter and his friends count the vegetables in Mr McGregors garden.</p> <p style="color: blue;">https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/puzzles/peter-rabbit-counting</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Magic Beans</u></p> <p>The adult calls out a type of bean and the child must do the corresponding activity. Model the activity first, showing the child what to do for each type of bean then see if they can remember by themselves.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Jumping bean- jump Broad bean- make yourself wide Baked bean- curl up small Jelly bean- wobble your body</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Fizz Inflator</u></p> <p>Try the science experiment 'Fizz inflator' explained on the additional page. <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Story time</u></p> <p>Go to the school website and watch some of the storytelling sessions. There is a range of wonderful stories on here to watch together.</p> <p>Talk about your favourite story or your favourite part in each story you listen to.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Beetle Game</u></p> <p>Have a go at the beetle game attached. Each number on the dice tells you what you can add to your beetle. You must get a 6 first so you have a body.</p> <p>Encourage children to recognise the pattern of dots on the dice instead of needing to count each time.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Fiddly Fingers</u></p> <p>Spend time practicing doing your zip and even challenge yourself to do buttons. You could just give your child a t-shirt to practice with, they don't need to be wearing it!</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Music</u></p> <p style="color: blue;">https://www.bbc.co.uk/games/embed/cbeebies-andys-safari-sounds?</p> <p>This is a great game for making your own music.
