

<p>Week 2</p> <p>Traditional Tales</p>	<p>Fetch Game-</p> <p>Using items around the house and a timer, challenge your child to find objects from around your house before the time runs out. You could make this a little more challenging by asking them to fetch a certain item and put it in a particular place. i.e. ‘Get a <u>sock</u> and put it in the <u>basket</u>’.
